LOCAL DEMOCRACY WILL SAVE DEMOCRACY

Four days of exciting events, more than 200 participants coming from all over Europe and beyond, debates, conferences, workshops: the **ALDA Festival and General Assembly 2023** was this and so much more.

From June 6 until June 9, 2023, the ALDA staff, members and whole network of the Association met in Brussels, Belgium, for the most important annual event of the year: the ALDA General Assembly.

In 2023, this key event entitled "Local Democracy will save Democracy" was conceived to engage the whole network of members and partners, involving them not only in the culminating event of the General Assembly, but also in a series of related activities to discuss and reflect together on current challenges and events, European values, priorities and next steps.



30 YEARS OF LOCAL DEMOCRACY

This year's ALDA Festival and General Assembly had a different taste, because the event was carried out on the occasion of an important anniversary, namely **30 years since the establishment of the very first Local Democracy Agency** in the Balkans, the LDA Subotica, which also marked the origin of ALDA's presence in the Balkans. Since then, the network and expertise of the LDAs and of ALDA itself, has only expanded and deepened.





ALDA General Assembly

The highlight of this 4-day long event was most certainly the ALDA General Assembly, which took place on June 8 in the beautiful and historical location of the Etterbeek Municipal Hall, kindly hosted by the Mayor of Etterbeek, Mr. Vincent De Wolf. We have been very proud of noticing an increasing participation and engagement by the whole network of ALDA, the hall was filled with members' representative, partners and friends of the Association, who not only had the chance to acquire a new understanding of ALDA's activities in Europe and beyond, but could also actively participate in shaping ALDA's present and future action plans. The opening of the General Assembly was conferred to the vice-president of the European Commission, Ms. Dubravka Suica, which enlightened the audience with an insightful speech on the importance of Local Democracy.

Extremely interesting speeches were also delivered by our keynote speakers namely, the President of the <u>Congress of Local and Regional Authorities</u>, **Mr. Leendert Verbeek**; the Head of Unit of the programme Europe for Citizens, Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (<u>EACEA</u>), **Mr. Gilles Pelayo**; and the Executive Secretariat of the <u>Central European Initiative</u>, **Mr. Ugo Poli**.

They all emphasised how crucial it is to act locally and to promote and sustain local democracy, so that a solid foundation can be built to establish a resilient global one.

The ALDA General Assembly continued with the presentation of the paper "Local Democracy will Save Democracy" by Ms. Daniela Ciaffi, Labsus vice president and ALDA member: a publication that capitalises on the experience of ALDA and its members and partners in an attempt to contribute to the challenges posed to Democracy in Europe and in the world. The event concluded with the preview of "ALDA, Europe", the documentary on the 30 years anniversary of the Local Democracy Agencies in the Balkans, produced by Mr. Francesco Zarzana, ALDA vice president, and director of Progettarte Officina Culturale.



EU Programmes and tools to support citizens participation, democracy and good governance Event

ALDA's commitment to support democracy and good governance in Europe and beyond, is based on key policies of the EU which are implemented through a number of different programmes. The aim of the workshop was to present the main "EC tools and programmes" that ALDA employs to achieve its goals and, thus, contribute to the mission and the objective of the EU. With this 2-hours workshop, ALDA gave the opportunity to the attendees to increase their knowledge around the **EU funding and opportunities and provided information and tools to support citizens participation, democracy and good governance.**





Follow-up on the Conference on the Future of Europe: discussing the Final Draft of the Sub-Group Democracy

This workshop, was aimed at presenting the final draft document regarding the topic of Democracy, Rule of Law, Civic Space and EU in the World as a key section of the **Civil Society State of the Union Report** that was disseminated in September 2023 as a follow-up of the work done during the Conference on the Future of Europe.

ALDA, together with the European Civic Forum, chaired the chapter I of the Report, entitled "Strengthening democracy, fundamental rights and civic space in the EU and the world" and contributed to creating a vision for the European Union as a vibrant democracy, where citizens actively participate in decision-making processes and have trust in their institutions. ALDA envisioned an EU that upholds the rule of law, protects fundamental rights, and promotes equality and social cohesion.

Digitalisation & 2024 European elections: P-CUBE project final conference & TALE world café

The <u>P-CUBE project</u> - Playing Public Policy, focuses on helping people understand how decisions are made in the public sphere by gamifying various elements of policy. During the event, the final version of the Policy Game was unveiled and presented to the audience.







Regarding the TALE project, which aims to engage a larger number of voters in the upcoming European parliamentary elections 2024, this event served as an opportunity to inform citizens about EU priorities, values, and activities foreseen. lt. also served to raise awareness among young people on the importance of the elections, stimulating their active participation.


Challenges for local communities in the face of migration of Ukrainians during the war

30 Years Local Democracy Agencies in the Balkans

During this event, ALDA and its network looked back together on the road so far and discussed tomorrow's commitments.
